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
Why South Oakleigh College!

Academic Connections & Success

- South Oakleigh College students have achieved outstanding VCE and ATAR results this past year our school achieved a median study score of 30 with the highest ATAR being 96.95 and 36% of scored VCE students receiving an ATAR of 80+
- High tertiary entry rates 86% of 2022 VCE students received a first round offer
- The top 3 University destinations for 2022 VCE students was Monash University, Deakin University and RMIT
- A South Oakleigh College we have many connections with notable Universities that offer our students additional programs and enrichment opportunities to further their academic success:
 - In2Science (RMIT) Undergraduate mentors volunteer their time to connect with our top students to engage, motivate, share ideas and support them on a tertiary pathway
 - Aviation Academy (RMIT) Connecting the aviation and space industry, tertiary and workforce sectors to increase awareness of pathways and programs in the aviation space
 - Al Project with PhD Student Alison McGregor (Victoria University) Running specialist programs with our Girls in STEM club to gather data and nurture growth and capacity in coding, cyber security and robotics
 - Monash Tech School Design Thinking Programs to provide students with real-world experiences and skill development

- Co-curricular activities throughout the year offer our students an array of opportunities to participate in school events and display their talents
- Leadership opportunities in the Student Representative Council (SRC), Peer Support Programs, Global Prefects, House Captains and more. With specialised leadership training and induction
- Enrichment Clubs run during recess and lunchtime including chess club, homework club, STEM Club, Media Club and more.

Being Resilient

Don't be ashamed if you feel different at first. It might take a while to adjust to the foreign education system and the environment. Stay positive and learning from your experiences.



Competitions & Events

Don't be afraid to step outside your comfort zone and try out competitions and events, both in school and interschool.



Talk to your Subject Teachers

If you are an EAL student who requires translations sometimes, remind your teachers of this, especially in English and Humanities. Ask them if they can adjust heir style of questions to be more literal, so they are easier to translate.



Homework Club & Tutoring

Take advantage of the Homework Club and the tutoring program. These are especially helpful for English, Humanities and Maths.



Seek Assistance
