At South Oakleigh College, our successful International Student Program is recognised for its quality and for how well it caters for a diverse group of students. We provide a supportive and stimulating environment for all students, and a comprehensive curriculum designed to help students become successful in further studies, work and life in a fast-changing world.

- an extensive English as an Additional Language (EAL) program
- International Student Program assistants who offer each student individual support and tutoring

A high-quality academic program

Global prefects' perspective

South Oakleigh College has teachers with diverse cultural backgrounds that can advise you in your preferred language about different subjects, including science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) and arts. The school offers a tutoring program that can develop students' understanding in literacy, numeracy and humanities.

South Oakleigh College offers an international language program that includes Greek and Japanese language courses. To access the program, students can select the language course that they wish to enrol during subject selection at the beginning of the school year. These language courses operate within the school grounds, and we offer advanced, mainstream and beginner courses in these languages, so don't worry if you're not confident!

Studying these languages can provide a deeper understanding and appreciation of the cultures associated with them. By learning a language, students can gain insight into the customs, values, and beliefs of a particular community. For example, by studying Greek, students can learn about ancient Greek civilisation, mythology, and literature, as well as the modern Greek culture and way of life. Similarly, studying Japanese can expose students to the rich cultural heritage of Japan, including its traditions, arts, and technology.

In addition to expanding cultural knowledge, learning a new language also has practical benefits. Furthermore, it can prepare students for future international travel and work opportunities.

We look forward to welcoming all international students to our College and assisting in the further development of cultural knowledge and diversity, in our extensively inclusive community.

A variety of extra-curricular activities

We offer students a wide range of opportunities to explore their learning, deepen friendships and develop new talents through our extra-curricular programs. These include:

Serious about student welfare

Our International Student Program is supported by an international team who are dedicated to supporting students in every aspect of their school lives.

Our international student team is comprised of our principal and assistant principal, an international student coordinator, international student assistant, multicultural aides and our English as an Additional Language (EAL) teachers.

As well as classroom teachers, international students are also supported by our head of house, mentor teacher, careers/pathways coordinator, wellbeing team and the sub-school leaders.

To assist our international students in adjusting to studying in Australia, we have a network of support professionals who have significant experience in addressing concerns of students from a wide range of cultures. We pride ourselves on our open-door policy when it comes to offering support to students; we encouraged to ask for help and guidance whenever they need it.

Homestay for international students

In Victoria, all government school homestay families provide:

- a safe, secure, welcoming place to live
- a household compliant with the Child Safe Standards
- a separate single room for your personal use
- three meals a day, seven days a week, including snacks
- facilities a bed, wardrobe, towels and linen
- utilities gas, electricity, heating and water costs, internet
- cleaning services of common living areas
- the use of living areas within the residence
- study facilities desk, study light, bookcase
- attendance at parent/teacher evenings on behalf of your parents.

Some of our South Oakleigh international students live with their parents or approved relatives. One of our student's relatives, Jessica, had this to say about the program:

"Studying overseas might be difficult and challenging for international students, but my niece, Tris, has been enjoying her journey studying in Australia. The school keeps in touch with us by emailing attendance records, term reports and checking in about students' wellbeing. It helps us to know that our child is being taken care of and the school always supports international students both academically as well as in their health and wellbeing."

Easily accessible location

South Oakleigh College is in the south-eastern suburbs of Melbourne, with the area well-serviced by trains and buses. The college has attractive school grounds and is close to native parkland and reserves. South Oakleigh College is also close to:
